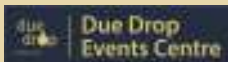

AMALIA HALL

Dvořák was a strong voice in the re-establishment of Czech musical identity, and the noble themes, depicting open landscapes, and the dancing Scherzo of the Symphony No 6 bear the stamp of a genius at his height. Here Dvořák pays tribute to both his mentor Brahms and to the rich folk music of his Bohemian homeland. From the exhilarating opening to the triumphant finale, you will be transported to a world of enchantment.



ANDREW JOYCE

The concert opens with the world premiere of 'The Coming of Night' for orchestra by the young English composer Sarah Frances Jenkins, commissioned by the MSO. This evocative work is inspired by a poem of the same title by Emily Dickinson and aims to explore the atmospheres, colours, and images within her depiction of twilight and the transition from sunset to night. The work was premiered as a Sextet originally by the BBC Concert Orchestra.

Love is pervasive in music, as it is in life. Follow Tchaikovsky's passions of love and tragedy through melodic beauty and sumptuous instrumentation. The MSO will take you on an emotional journey through Shakespeare's classic story in one of the composer's most loved works.

Experience the extraordinary talent of Michael Houstoun as he navigates the intricate and virtuosic melodies of Shostakovich's Piano Concerto No 2. This light-spirited piece with a hauntingly beautiful slow movement was written as a birthday present to his son Maxim in 1957. The ending makes the pianist climb to the edge of the keyboard and will keep you at the edge of your seats!

Beethoven's 'Eroica' Symphony is a masterpiece that marks a turning point in the history of classical music, ushering in the Romantic era with its groundbreaking innovation and emotional depth. One of the most iconic anecdotes associated with the 'Eroica' involves its dedication. When Beethoven composed the symphony, he originally dedicated it to Napoleon Bonaparte, whom he admired as a champion of liberty and equality. However, as history unfolded, Beethoven's opinion of Napoleon soured when the French leader declared himself Emperor of all of Europe. In a fit of rage Beethoven reportedly tore the title page from the score and renamed it simply 'Sinfonia Eroica' (Heroine Symphony) and exclaimed, "...so he is no more than a common mortal! Now, too, he will tread underfoot all the rights of man, indulge only his ambition; now he will think himself superior to all men, become a tyrant!"

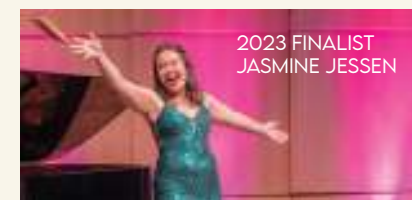
The South Auckland area is brimming with talented vocalists and it has been a long-held aspiration to host an aria competition for these singers, to help develop and support their future careers.

MANUKAU SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA



The Manukau Symphony Orchestra began life in 1993, through the former Manukau City Council's desire to form a community orchestra based in South Auckland. The orchestra has grown from a humble 22-member ensemble playing at the Papatoetoe Town Hall to a full-sized symphony orchestra. Its home base is at the Due Drop Events Centre but the rehearsal space, library and storage are at Te Tuhi, in Pakuranga. The MSO continues to expand its appeal and audiences through providing accessible, quality, live symphonic orchestral experiences in one of Auckland's most diverse urban areas.

The orchestra is a part-time and volunteer organisation with professional leadership. Governed by the Manukau Orchestral Society, the orchestra continues to uplift the wairua and culture of Manukau's tangata whenua. The Orchestra has created a safe environment to experience and experiment with music, providing opportunities for people to come together to play music and become part of this community.

MSO musicians are comprised of approximately 33% professional mentors, 33% community and 33% youth players. Participants in orchestral projects and workshops come from all over the Auckland region: 45% from South and East, 35% from West and Central, 18% from the North Shore, and 3% from outside the region.

MSO TUAKANA MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The MSO prides itself on its Mentorship Programme which was established in 1993, giving youth and community players the opportunity to participate in an orchestra alongside professional mentors. Each participant has something unique to offer, making playing together a mutual learning encounter. Known as the MSO Tuakana Mentorship Programme, the term Tuakana comes from Tuakana-teina (meaning: older sibling, younger sibling) which is a learning approach drawn from Te Ao Māori. Originating on the Marae, it is now used to describe equal and interchangeable learning relationships in the context of adult education. It recognises that all MSO players, regardless of age



and background, can grow, explore and refine their technique and musical expression through playing together and sharing perspectives.



MSO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

The MSO Youth Scholarship program runs parallel to the mentorship programme. In 2024 we have offered scholarships to young players including the first Youth Conducting Scholar, to assist with their tuition, as well as providing at least two guaranteed places in our subscription series concerts. Robert Liu, Conductor, now aged 17, was a scholarship recipient in 2023. Robert writes about the scholarship as an

'opportunity which allowed me to interact and enter the world of conducting. Since then, my conducting skills have improved "miles".'

The MSO wishes to thank Phil and Helen Greenbank and The Stringed Instrument Company for making this programme possible. Scholarships will be presented on stage at the HOUSTOUN & EROICA concert at the end of the year.
